SIGNING OF MEMORANDUM AND ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION.

At the first meeting of the interim Federal Council of the Australian Medical Association held at British Medical Association House, 88 L'Estrange Terrace, Kelvin Grove, Brisbane, on October 22, 1961, the Memorandum and Articles of Association of the Australian Medical Association were signed by the office bearers and other members of the Federal Council.

At the same time the Federal Council approved a draft agreement prepared by the Council of the British Medical Association in London covering affiliation of the Australian Medical Association with the British Medical Association.

The meeting will be more fully reported at a later date.

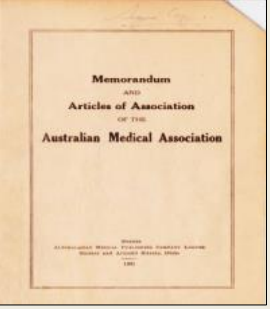
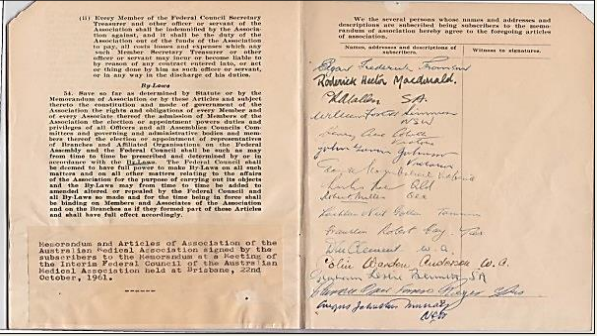
The members of the interim Federal Council are as follows: **Office Bearers of the Association:** President, Dr. H. C. Colville; Vice-President, Dr. A. J. Murray; Chairman of Federal Assembly, Dr. L. R. Mallen; Treasurer, Dr. W. F. Simmons. **Representatives of Branches:** Dr. R. H. Macdonald, Dr. E. F. Thomson (New South Wales); Dr. J. G. Johnson, Dr. T. G. Swinburne (Victoria); Dr. R. A. M. Miller, Dr. Charles Roe (Queensland); Dr. C. O. F. Rieger (South Australia); Dr. C. W. Anderson, Dr. D. M. Clement (Western Australia); Dr. L. N. Gollan, Dr. F. R. Fay (Tasmania). The General Secretary is Dr. J. G. Hunter, and the Assistant General Secretary is Dr. C. J. Ross-Smith.

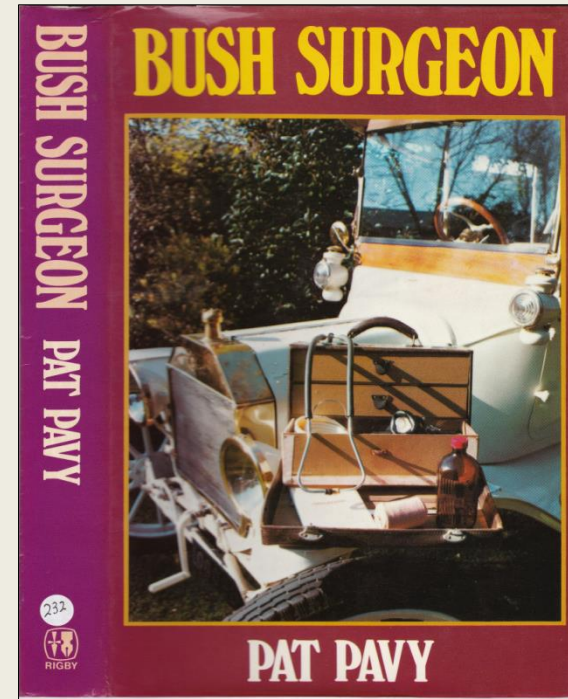


PAT PAVY was born at Crystal Brook, South Australia, in 1895, his grandfather being one of the original settlers. He went to Adelaide in 1900, attended the North Adelaide Public School, and graduated from the Adelaide Medical School in 1919. In 1930 he obtained his Fellowship of the Royal College of Surgeons, Edinburgh, and was admitted to the Australian College in 1932, doing further post-graduate work in America, England, and Sweden during 1938.

After being a medical officer in No. 7 A.G.H. and the Adelaide Children's Hospital in 1920 and 1921, he practised in Naracoorte until 1954, when he moved to North Terrace, Adelaide. He was medical officer of the Naracoorte District Hospital for thirty years, a town councillor for a couple of years, and was made a life member of the Naracoorte Race Club and the Golf Club. Alice Springs was explored in 1933, partly on camels, and 1935 saw him as Ship's Surgeon aboard S.S. *Changte*, visiting Manila and Hong Kong.

During the second World War Dr Pavy served as Surgeon Specialist with the rank of Major with No. 119 A.G.H. at Darwin, then on the Hospital Ship *Wanganella*, and finally with the 2/4 A.G.H. He has been in the Legacy Club since 1951, serving as Vice-President, and as the Chairman of the Medical, Country Liason, and Pension committees. He retired from active practice in 1973 and now lives in the Adelaide suburb of Netherby.

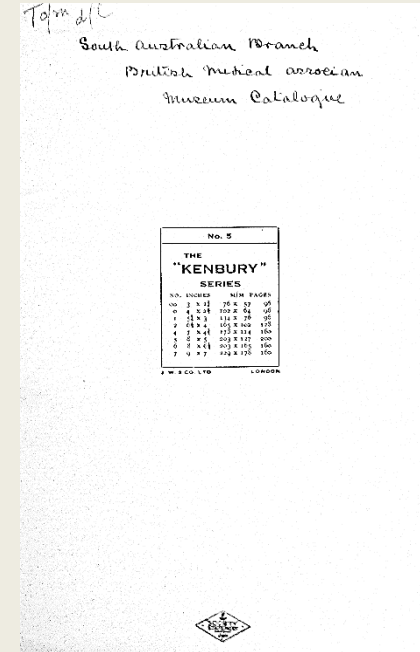
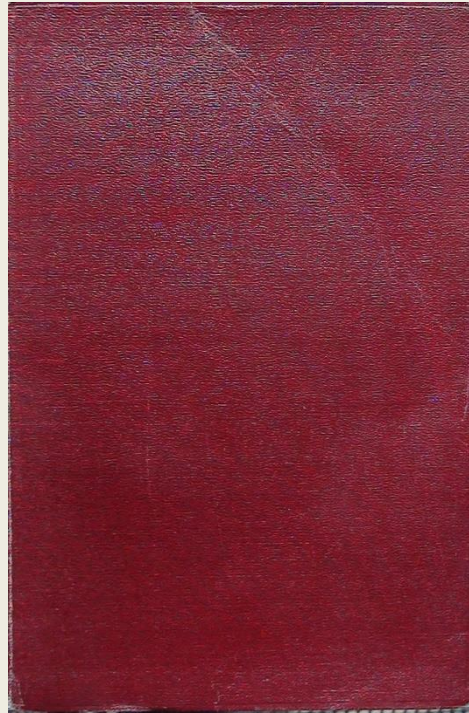
J C Verco developed an inventory of medical and surgical artefacts which over time has been dispersed.

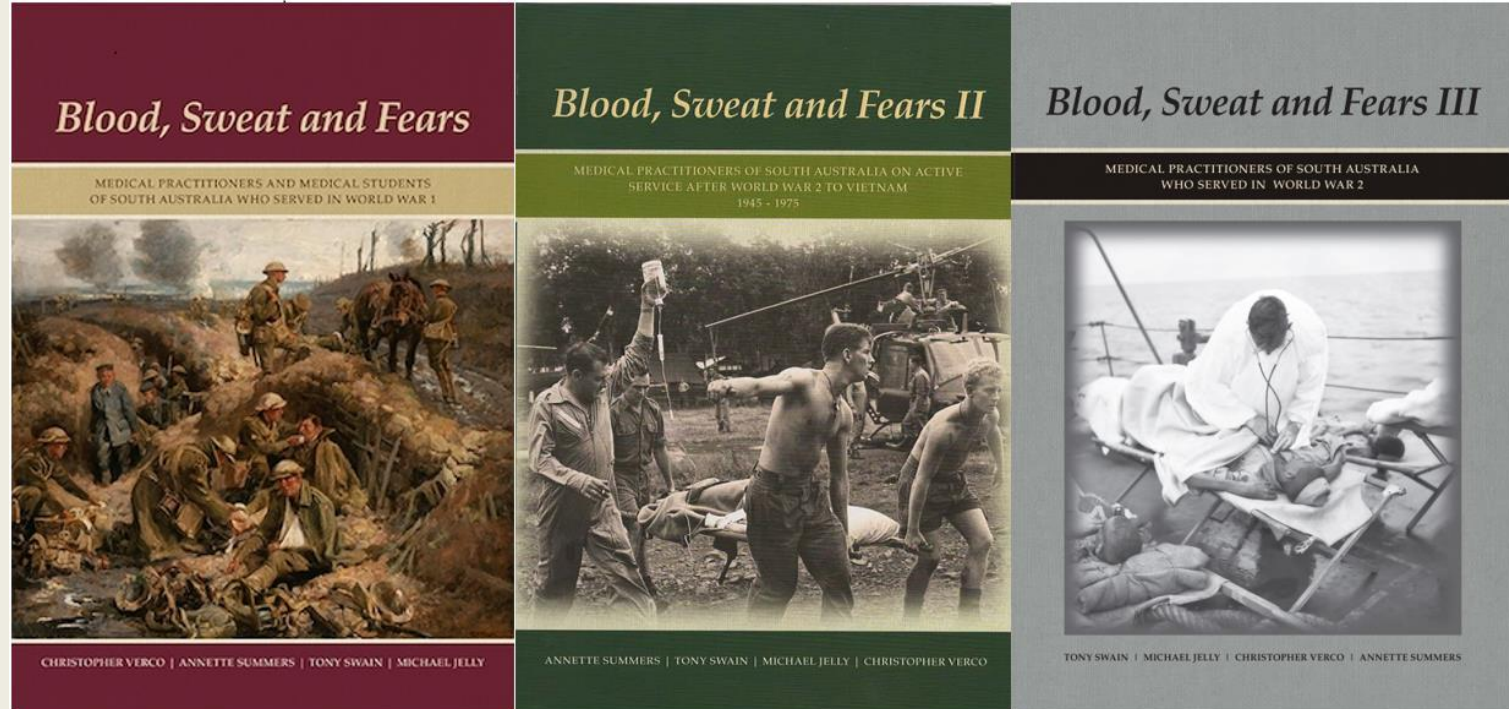

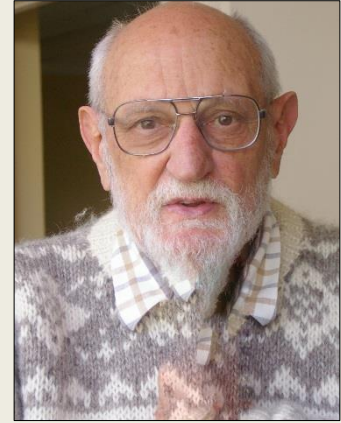

- (ii) Every Member of the Federal Council Secretary Treasurer and other officer or servant of the Association shall be indemnified by the Association against, and it shall be the duty of the Association out of the funds of the Association to pay, all costs losses and expenses which any such Member Secretary Treasurer or other officer or servant may incur or become liable to by reason of any contract entered into, or act or thing done by him as such officer or servant, or in any way in the discharge of his duties.

By-Laws

54. Save so far as determined by Statute or by the Memorandum of Association or by these Articles and subject thereto the constitution and mode of government of the Association the rights and obligations of every Member and of every Associate thereof the admission of Members of the Association the election or appointment powers duties and privileges of all Officers and all Assemblies Councils Committees and governing and administrative bodies and members thereof the election or appointment of representatives of Branches and Affiliated Organisations on the Federal Assembly and the Federal Council shall be such as may from time to time be prescribed and determined by or in accordance with the By-Laws. The Federal Council shall be deemed to have full power to make By-Laws on all such matters and on all other matters relating to the affairs of the Association for the purpose of carrying out its objects and the By-Laws may from time to time be added to amended altered or repealed by the Federal Council and all By-Laws so made and for the time being in force shall be binding on Members and Associates of the Association and on the Branches as if they formed part of these Articles and shall have full effect accordingly.
